SPRING AND RIVER REJUVENATION AUTHORITY

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Feasibility Assessment for Developing a Carbon Finance Project in Uttarakhand through National Competitive Procurement Process

1. BACKGROUND

In the light of the conditions becoming increasingly difficult day by day for local life due to global climate change and man-made factors and continuously drying up water sources in the state of Uttarakhand in the last few decades, there is a need to identify the natural water sources and rainfed rivers of the state using scientific methods and achieve the goal of revitalization of rivers and continuous flow in water sources by treating them in a phased manner through various soil and moisture conservation interventions like- check dams, contour trenches, recharge pits etc.

To achieve this, the interventions of various line departments needs to be integrated. In view of the, after due consideration, the government has decided to establish Spring and River Rejuvenation Authority (SARRA) under the Watershed Management Directorate.

It is the Nodal agency of the State for capacity development of various line Departments, Institutes, N.G.O's of the State and Watershed Department for scientific planning, implementation & financing and monitoring & evaluation of Spring and River Rejuvenation programmes in the State of Uttarakhand.

2. DESCRIPTION

The purpose of establishment of Spring and River Rejuvenation Authority (SARRA) at State level is to identify all the water sources of the state which need to be rejuvenated on priority to ensure increase in sustainable water discharge and pereniality of the rainfed rivers. It is targeted to be achieved by ensuring community participation of local people for sustainable flow of springs, streams and rainfed-rivers, i.e., the overall improvement of riverine ecosystem.

3. NEED FOR CONSULTANCY SUPPORT

Various Projects are being implemented by the Watershed Management Directorate

(WMD), Government of Uttarakhand, across various landscapes in Pauri District of Uttarakhand, representing a significant initiative to promote biodiversity conservation, sustainable land management, and climate resilience. The project's plantation activities, including orchard development, agroforestry plantations, river bank plantations, pastureland development, homestead plantations, and post-Lantana eradication plantations such as mulberry, offer strong potential for generating verified carbon credits under Global Voluntary Carbon Market (VCM) mechanisms. These credits can be leveraged to attract climate finance, which in turn can strengthen community participation and ensure long-term sustainability of restoration activities. Recognizing this potential, the Watershed Management Directorate (WMD) is willing to seek technical support from Consulting agencies to undertake a **Feasibility Study for developing a Carbon Finance Project**.

4. OBJECTIVE

The primary objective of this assignment is to undertake a comprehensive feasibility assessment for developing a carbon finance project in Uttarakhand under SARRA across selective areas of Pauri District.

The study is aimed to evaluate the technical viability, financial attractiveness, and institutional readiness of various project interventions for generating carbon credits under globally recognized Voluntary Carbon Market frameworks such as Verra (VCS) and Gold Standard. It will systematically identify plantation and landscape restoration areas with measurable carbon sequestration potential, assess baseline biomass and soil carbon levels, and project future carbon accrual using scientifically sound and internationally compliant methodologies. Furthermore, the assessment aims to determine long-term carbon revenue opportunities and develop sustainable governance mechanisms that ensure equitable benefit-sharing with local farming communities. The outcome of this assignment is expected to serve as a strategic foundation for mobilizing climate finance and strengthening the adoption of nature-based solutions and landscape restoration initiatives across the selected districts.

5. SCOPE OF WORK

The assignment shall include, but not be limited to, the following components:

- Land Eligibility and Suitability Analysis using RS–GIS tools to identify degraded, fallow, or underutilized lands suitable for ARR (Afforestation, Reforestation, and Revegetation) interventions.

- Baseline Carbon Stock Assessment through field sampling and RS–GIS modelling using IPCC Tier II/III methodologies.
- Economic and Financial Feasibility to evaluate cost-benefit and potential revenue from carbon credits under different price and survival scenarios.
- Institutional and Policy Review to assess readiness and convergence opportunities with existing schemes.
- Investor Engagement and Carbon Standard Alignment to explore linkages with potential investors and assess registration feasibility under Verra/Gold Standard.
- Preparation of Feasibility Report with district-wise mapping, technical, financial, and institutional recommendations.

6. STUDY AREA

The proposed feasibility assessment will focus on the various landscapes within Pauri District, which will serve as the primary study area.

7. EXPERIENCE OF THE AGENCY and COMPOSITION OF THE EXPERT TEAM INVOLVED BY THE AGENCY

A- The agency must have the following expertise

- Agency shall be a private entity, government-owned entity or, any combination of these having a formal intent and legal competency to enter into an agreement or contract and are registered under respective Act and Jurisdiction in India.
